Heating Rebate Scheme	Under this scheme the Council offers a rebate to residents of the Borough who are replacing their boiler with an A rated energy efficient boiler.	On-going
Warm Homes Healthy People Project	Lancashire County Council secured £716,818 of funding from the department of Health this winter to support local authority projects that reduce the cold weather related deaths and illness of vulnerable people. Burnley Council's project provided a boiler servicing and repair scheme, draft proofing, emergency heating and winter warmth packs.	Dec – March 2013

Lancashire Home Energy Officers Group	The Lancashire Home Energy Officers Group consist of representatives from the 12 district councils in Lancashire, Blackburn with Darwen Council, Blackpool Council, Lancashire County Council and Lancashire County Development Ltd. The group was established in 2007 and work in partnership to improve the energy efficiency of Lancashire Homes, address health inequalities exacerbated by living in cold damp homes, reduce fuel poverty, tackle seasonal excess deaths and reduce carbon emissions from the domestic sector.
