REASON The Committee thanked the applicant for his efforts made so far to meet with the licensing objectives within the application.

The Committee granted the licence as requested in the application, but only subject to the conditions set out in the e mail from Jayne Enright on 12 June 2014 because the Committee believed these conditions to be reasonable and necessary for the application to meet with the licensing objectives relating to public safety and the prevention of public nuisance.
