BURNLEY COUNCIL'S GARDEN WASTE COLLECTION SCHEME

If you are already subscribed to the collection scheme (using a brown wheelie bin with a green sticker) then your collections will start again from 11th/18th March after the usual winter break. Please check your collection calendar.

Your annual subscription will cover collections up until the end of April. If you want them to continue for another year, from 1st May, you need to pay your subscription for 2019/20. You can subscribe to the service from March 2019 to ensure an uninterrupted collection service. Sign up online at:

KEY FACTS

- The garden waste subscription service takes effect annually from 1st May
- The cost for the garden waste subscription is £30 per year plus £25 for each additional bin
- The charge of £30 per year equates to £1.50 per collection (20 collections a year)
- Your new blue sticker will be sent out straight away to ensure a continuous service until the end of April 2020 please allow 10 days for delivery
- The blue sticker lets our collection crew know that you've signed up for this year's collection - please display as soon as you get it





QUESTIONS

If I register for the scheme half way through the year, do I get a discount?

No the price is £30 per bin for the year regardless of when you actually join the scheme. The garden waste subscription service will run from 1st May to 30th April each year. No refunds can be given.

Will my time of collection change? Yes. It is likely that collection times will vary, therefore it is essential that the bin is presented from 6.30am.

If I don't want to sign up and pay, how can I dispose of my garden waste?

If you choose not to subscribe to the scheme your garden waste will not be collected. Garden waste can be taken to the household recycling centre at Heasandford Industrial Estate, or you may wish to consider home composting.
